4.4.2 – Procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc. (maximum 500 words) (information to be available in institutional Website, provide link)

The college is governed and managed by the Uttarakhand Government. The Directorate, Higher Education provides funds for Purchase and Maintenance of Academic and nonacademic facilities of the college. During the academic year the physical facilities of the college includes thirty classrooms, 02 computer lab, library building, separate PG Block and B.Ed. Building, one boys hostel, Principal's and Hostel Warden's accommodation. Boys hostel with a capacity of 55 students is also available in the college. The college also has 20 male and 12 female toilets. The college maintains these physical facilities by timely renovation and maintenance. To meet the needs of the furniture, old furniture is repaired and new furniture is purchased. There was also a changeover from Blackboards to White/Green Boards. The procedure for provision of funds is done by the Uttarakhand Government and in case of scarcity of funds efforts are made to arrange funds from the local MLA and MP Fund. Books are provided to the students for the entire term which helps the students from economically backward classes. The college also has 5 classrooms with ICT techniques through which teachers are able to impart their lectures in a concise and precise manner. The library is updated timely with new books as per the changes in the syllabus. Under the RUSA scheme 3500 books were purchased. Similarly, the laboratory of Physics and Chemistry department were updated with new equipments. A new computer lab with 16 computers along with internet facilities was formed. The students can view the Programs telecasted by the Government of India like Man kiBaat etc. A sports ground is available in the college and it has Volleyball, Basketball, KhoKho, Football and Cricket Courts. Once a year InterCollegiate University competition in one of the above stated sports activity is held in the college along with the Annual Sports Function. The students go to different colleges of the state to participate in different sports competition. The funds for the Sports facilities are managed from the Sports fees charged annually by the students.

Exam Cell PNG Government PG College, Ramnagar is affiliated to Kumaon University, Nainital. The schedule and the question papers for the examination are made by the University and the college has to adhere to the same. The conduct of exams in the college is a hectic and strenuous process as the college caters to 4000 to 5000 students studying in different courses and different subjects in the college. The examinations are conducted twice a year that is The Odd Semester Exam from End of December to first week of February and The Even Semester exam from Mid of May to First week of July. The examinations are conducted in three shifts in a day Morning, Afternoon and Evening. For the successful and convenient conduct of examinations, Exam Committee is formed with a Exam Incharge and 5 to 6 members. The members are allotted their respective shifts and the concerned members are responsible for the shifts. The Exam Committee includes nonteaching staff also along with the teaching staff. The nonteaching staff is responsible for making the seating schedule, arrangements of the classrooms, arranging the verification cards, arranging for water and other similar work. Principal acts as the Centre Superintendent. The Exam cell appoints teachers and the nonteaching staff as Invigilators. The duties are assigned to the invigilators by the Exam Incharge. The Flying Squad of the college ensures fair and hassle free exams in the college. Departmental Councils Departmental Councils are made by every department of the college for the conduct of academic classes besides the classroom sessions. The Council has posts of President, VicePresident, Secretary, CoSecretary, Treasurer and Class Representatives from all the classes. The selection of students for these posts is done by the method of election at the classlevel. The members of the Council along with the faculty members of the department organize academic activities throughout the year. These activities include seminars, interclass quiz, poster competition, essay

competition, social issues, guest lectures, making of the models, etc. The college has a provision of sanctioning a fund of Rs 2000 for the activities of the Departmental Councils for each department. Interdepartmental activities are also carried out. The students engage in the arrangement of these activities which prepares them for their future endeavours. These activities bring out the hidden abilities of the students and promote personality development in a better way.

The New Construction work allotted under the RUSA scheme Phase I is completed and The rest was under progress. The college has send the proposal for sanction of fund under RUSA Scheme Phase II for Component 9 which is related to Infrastructural Development. The college has been sanctioned two crore under this scheme. A computer center and two classrooms will be

#### 8. Future Plans of Actions for Next Academic Year

201819 • Research and Development activities • Preparation for the NAAC inspection in 2020. • Proposal for the increase in the number of sanctioned posts for the teachers. During the Academic year 201819 the research and development of activities were limited to the conduct of one National Seminar by the Department of Commerce. Hence for the next sessions efforts will be made by the faculty members to prepare proposals for Research projects and the same will be send to the funding agencies like UGC, ICSSR, CSIR, UCOST etc. The faculty members will also be encouraged and motivated by the IQAC to prepare, present and publish research papers in UGC Indexed Journals. NAAC inspection for the third cycle accreditation is scheduled for 2020. The IQAC Committee will complete the AQAR and submit them to NAAC for approval. Besides, the team will also prepare SSR timely for the successful completion of the NAAC accreditation. Efforts will be made by the college to get a high scoring in the NAAC inspection. NAAC accreditation with high scoring will help college to get considerable funding from the Government and other funding agencies. During the previous year the number of seats for the students was increased to meet the growing demand of the students. However, even after continuous efforts of the college administration the sanctioned posts of the teachers have remained the same. Secondly due to constant transfers of the teachers from the college there is huge gap in the filled and sanctioned posts of teachers. Efforts will be made by the college administration to report the scenario to the Directorate, Higher Education and the State Government of Uttarakhand. Twofold demand will be made in this context. Firstly, fill the vacant posts with permanent staff or by the Guest Faculty as a time gap arrangement. Secondly, proposal will be send to the higher authorities for increasing the number of sanctioned to meet the increasing number of students.
