#### Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

**1. Core Paper:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

**2. Elective Paper:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

**3. Open Elective Paper:** In this section one paper is introduced as an open elective paper in Semester 3 & 4.

**4. Dissertation/Project:** This is designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project. This is compulsory core paper for all students in Semester 3.

**5. Viva Voce:** Viva Voce is compulsory in Semester 4 for each student as Core Paper.
